Cultural & Linguistic Diversity

The California legislature has passed AB 1195 which states that as of July 1, 2006 all AMA PRA Category 1 Credit[™] CME activities that relate to patient care must include a cultural diversity/linguistics component. Specifically, the learner must be provided with relevant cultural diversity information relating to one or more of the following: age, gender, race, socioeconomics, sexual orientation, religion, language, ethnicity, etc. that would impact the care of the patient.
